
Falcon 2000LX for Beijing Red Cross

Dassault Aviation's versatile large cabin twin will be Beijing Red Cross Emergency Medical Center's first fixed wing aircraft dedicated to medevac services.

Beijing Red Cross Medical Center is buying a Falcon

2000LX, outfitted with an electrically powered patient loading system, a stretcher and full medical suite with patient lighting, triple bottle oxygen supply, and health monitoring sensors and instrumentation. The medevac configuration also will accommodate an electro-cardio graph, a defibrillator and blood/body fluid transfusion equipment.

The special medical kit is being installed by Dasssault Aircraft Service in Wilmington, Delaware, with customer delivery slated for September. Dassault Falcon 2000LX has a nearly 4,000 nm range with a 1,600 lb. payload, along with low takeoff and landing speeds and the ability to operate from airport elevations as high as 12,000 ft.

Falcon 2000LX is a well proven platform. More than 170 aircraft are in service around the globe.
